

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of South Boundary  
of T. 30 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.40\*E., 6 lks. dist.,  
marked T 31 S R 1 W S 2 B T (Old B T.)

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.80\*W., 27 lks. dist.,  
marked T 30 S R 1 W S 34 B T (Old B T.)

The old bearing tree referring to sec. 3 is dead  
and fallen.

I now change this cor. to refer to secs. 34 and 35 only,  
and obliterate the marks on the bearing tree referring  
to sec. 2.

At exact cor. point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in  
the ground, for cor. of secs. 34 and 35 only, with  
brass cap marked

Asc. SW. slope.

- 7.25 Enter openings, bears NW. and SE.
- 19.43 Creek, 2 lks. wide, C. SW.
- Leave openings; enter timber, bears NE. and SW.
- 28.73 630 ft. above sec. cor.; desc. 116 ft. over SE. slope.
- 33.25 Bluff, 30 ft. high, faces SE.
- 37.03½ Mid point bet. closing cors., determined as hereinafter  
described
