Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense  
undergrowth.

0.97 Spring, flows E.

3.60 Creek, 1 lk. wide, C. SE.

5.10 Creek, 1 lk. wide, C. SE.

5.80 Creek, 1 lk. wide, C. SE.

7.43 Creek, 1 lk. wide, C. SE.

Trail, bears NE. and SW.

Asc. 93 ft. on NE. slope.

16.00 Spur, slopes SE.; desc. 465 ft. on general S. slope.

34.77 Draw, C. SE.

40.58 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on old E. bdy. of sec. 13, established by  
Deputy Hathorn, located by reference to the original  
bearing trees, which are in agreement with the field  
notes, except that the W. tree is dead and fallen.

At exact corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the  
ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of original sec. 13, with brass  
cap marked

$\frac{1}{4}$  S13|  
1923

from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.66°W., 63 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 13 B T: new B T.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.49°W., 29 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 13 B T: new B T.

The marks are overgrown on the old bearing tree  
intended in the original survey to refer to  
sec. 18, T. 30 S., R. 1 E.
