Retracement and Boundaries of H E S No. 195

CHAINS

The bearing and length of line 2-3 is S.0°08'W., 20.02 chs.

Thence

West, from cor. No. 3, retracing line 3-4.

Desc. 25 ft. on SW. slope.

0.90 Right bank of South Fork of South Umpqua River, C. NW.

1.43 East bank of Island, bears NW. and SE.

2.85 West bank of same, bears NW. and SE.

3.49 Left bank of River; asc. 50 ft. on NE. slope.

4.00 Bluff, 35 ft. high, bears NW. and SE; continue ascent.

8.86 Top of ascent, bears NW. and SE; thence over level bench.

12.90 Top of bluff, 58 ft. high, faces W.

13.50 Left bank of South Fork of South Umpqua River, C. SW.

14.75 Right bank of river.

18.50 Asc. 90 ft. on gradual E. slope.

20.16 Intersect cor. No. 4, hereinbefore described.

The bearing and length of line 3-4, is West, 20.16 chs.

General Description

The portion of the township included in this survey is situated on both sides of the South Fork of the South Umpqua River. The river flows through a canyon with steep slopes on each side. Above the steep slopes are numerous benches and gentle slopes, with considerable land suitable for agriculture, particularly on the north side of the river, where there are numerous openings. The land on the south side of the river is covered with timber and brush, the timber being mainly of fair quality, fir predominating. North of the river the timber is somewhat scattering, though there are some bodies of heavy timber, both fir and pine.
