

## Re-Survey of West Boundary of T. 30 S., R. 2 W.

37.00	Ridge point, descending E.
38.10	Ravine, course E.
40.08½	Point midway on W bdy. Sec. 7. However, as this point is within limits of 25 lks., with the old ¼ Sec. cor. I therefore re-established the former ¼ Sec. cor. as the ¼ Sec. cor. common to Secs. 7 and 12.
40.25	Set a Cedar post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ Sec. cor. marked ¼ S 12 on W and 7 on E face, from which A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.2½*E., 76 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 7 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.61*W., 147 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 12 B T.
47.50	Ridge, bears NW and SE.
64.50	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E.
73.15	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E.
75.50	Ridge, bears NW and SE.
80.17	The closing cor. of Secs. 7 and 18. Land, mountainous. Soil, clay and loam; 2nd and 3rd rate. Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Madrone, Cedar. Undergrowth, Vinemaple, Hemlock, Fir and Hazel. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey. 80.17 chs.
	South, on W bdy. of Sec. 18. Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth, along E slope.
0.71	The cor. of Secs. 12 and 13, T. 30 S., R. 3 W.
0.76	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.
