

## Retracement of Subdivision of T. 30 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Timber, Fir Oak.

Undergrowth, Oak, Hazel, Vine-Maple.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey, 80.78 chs.

September 7: At this cor. I set off 6°07'N., on the decl arc. and at 11 h. 58 m. a.m. 1. m. t. observe the sun on the meridian. the resulting lat. is 42°56'

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Re-survey of Subdivision Lines of T. 30 S., R. 2 W.  
Same Deputy and Contract.

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From the cor. of secs. 29 and 30 on N. bdy. sec. 31,

I run East on random line on S. bdy. sec. 29.

0.88 The closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32.

Thence between secs. 29 and 32.

40.00 All traces of the old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. are destroyed by fire.  
Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

80.70 The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, partially obliterated.

Two of the bearing trees are not found. The other bearing trees and the cor. are deeply overgrown.

September 7, 1909.

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At the cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, I re-establish the cor. in its original position as follows:

The original cor. a Fir 15 in. diam., for cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, I mark

T 30 S, S 28 on NE.

R 2 W, S 33 on SE.

S. 32 on SW. and

S. 29 on NW sides, with 1 notch on S and 4 notches on E. side, from which,

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.33°E., 88 lks.

dist. marked T 30 S, R 2 W, S 28 B T.
