- 34.00 Trail on ridge bears E. and W.
Desc. S. slope.
- 43.60 Set a slate stone 14x8x6 ins., 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in the ground,
for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which,
A Madrone, 12 ins. diam., bears S.10*E., 27 lks.
dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T..
A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.35*W., 69 lks.
dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.
- 58.75 Ravine, course SW.
- 62.50 Low ridge, bears NE. and SW.
- 69.10 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SW.
Along W. slope.
