56.00	Top of steep ascent. Along E. slope.
72.10	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.
80.87	The closing cor. of secs. 16 and 21.
82.37	The cor. of secs. 17 and 20. Land, mountainous. Soil, clay and stony, 2nd and 4th rate. Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Madrone. Undergrowth, Hazel, Vine Maple, Hemlock. Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey, 82.37 chs.

	Thence I run S.0*2'E. bet. secs. 17 and 18. Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.
0.75	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NW. Asc. NW. slope.
10.00	Enter old burn.
14.50	Ridge point descending NW. Leave burn.
16.50	Head of ravine, course NW.
26.40	Ridge bears NW. and SE. Trail on ridge. Desc. S. slope.
40.00	Set a basalt stone 12x10x6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which, A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 60 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 17 B T. A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.4*W., 21 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 B T.
