

Subdivision of T. 30 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Over mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth.

Asc. E. slope.

1.65 A Cedar, 48 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.

3.50 Ridge point descending NE.

15.40 Trail to Perdue on summit of divide bet. S. Umpqua River and Coffee Creek bears N. and S.

Desc. steep W. slope.

21.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NW.

Along N. slope.

39.89 Set a quartz stone 12x10x6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which,

A Hemlock, 15 ins. diam., bears N.64 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 13 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 17 B T.

A Hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 59 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 20 B T.

72.50 Ridge bears SE. and W. Thence along ridge.

79.78 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay and granite, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock.

Undergrowth, Vine Maple, Hemlock, Hazel.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey, 79.78 chs.
