A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.  $12^{\circ}$ W., 31 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W C C S 34 and 35 B T.

Land, mountainous. 80.00 chs.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel, Maple and Cedar.

Dense undergrowth of Arrowwood, Laurel, Vine Maple,
