

Exterior Boundaries of T. 30 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

S Rs 2 and 3 W, which is a Fir tree 16 ins. diam., and not a post as stated in the field notes furnished me, marked T 29 S S 31 on NE R 2 W S 6 on SE T 30 S S 1 on SW and R 3 W S 36 on NW faces with 6 notches facing each cardinal point, from which

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.43*E., 51 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 2 W S 31 B T.

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.56*E., 45 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 2 W S 6 B T.

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.52*W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 1 B T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 4 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 3 W S 36 B T.

As this is not a cor. to T 30 S Rs 2 and 3 W I destroyed the marks on the SE. and SW. faces of this tree cor. and also the marks on the 2 Fir witness trees S. of cor. in T 30 S R 3 W. # At point of intersection I set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. to T 30 S Rs 2 and 3 W marked C C T 30 S on S-R 2 W S 6 on E and R 3 W S 1 on W faces with 6 notches on SE and W faces, from which

A Fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S.43 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 53 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 2 W S 6 B T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.68*W., 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 1 B T.

A Fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N.15 $\frac{3}{4}$ *E., 17 $\frac{3}{4}$ lks. dist., marked C C T 30 S Rs 2 and 3 W B T.

Land, mountainous. 49.76 chs.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel, Cedar, Chinquapin, and Maple. 49.76 chs.

Dense undergrowth of Vine Maple, Laurel, Hazel, Arrowwood, Cedar and Fir, .49.76 chs.
