

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N.64*W., 8½ lks. dist.,
marked ¼ S B T.

A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.21*E., 6½ lks. dist.,
marked ¼ S B T.

41.30 A stream, 4 lks. wide, course N.80*E. Ascend. +200

47.50 Top of ridge, course E. and W. Descend. -40

49.92 Intersect the North boundary of the Township at cor. to
secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a post greatly decayed
with surveyors marks on it but I cannot distinguish
them. I find 3 of the original witness trees at cor.
point. I set a Fir post, 5 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24
ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36,
marked T 29 S S.36 on NE; R 3 W S 1 on SE; T 30 S S.2 on
SW and S 35 on NW faces, with 1 notch on E and 5 notches
on W edges, from which

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.60*E., 63 lks. dist.,
marked T 29 S R 3 W S 36 B T.

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.85*W., 58 lks. dist.,
marked T 30 S R 3 W S 2 B T.

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.86*W., 42 lks. dist.,
marked T 29 S R 3 W S 35 B T.

These are the original witness trees. The witness tree
in sec. 1 is burnt. In its stead I mark a Fir, 7 ins.
diam., which bears S.35½*E., 46 lks. dist., marked T
30 S R 3 W S 1 B T.

Land, mountainous. 49.92 chs.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel and Maple. 49.92 chs.

Dense undergrowth of Vine Maple, Laurel, Thimbleberry
and Chinquapin. 49.92 chs.

As this closing is not within the prescribed limits I
return to the cor. to Township 29 S. Ranges 2 and 3 W.
