

## Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 3 W.

## CHAINS

From the cor. to secs. 34 and 35, on South boundary of Township.

I run

N.0°2'W., on a random line between secs. 34 and 35.

Va. 19½°E

40.00 Set temp. ¼ sec. cor.

71.95 Intersect E. and W. line and set temp. post. The cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, is gone. The witness trees have been chopped down. I find 2 Oak stumps marked B T with a surveyors scribe. At cor. point I set a river stone, 16 x 10 x 10 ins. 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, marked with 2 notches on E. and 1 notch on S. edges, from which

An Oak stump, 15 ins. diam., bears N.20°E., 136 lks. dist., marked B T.

An Oak stump, 12 ins. diam., bears S.28°W., 163 lks. dist., marked B T. I mark 4 witness trees.

A Pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N.77°E., 85 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 26 B T.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.18°E., 93 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 35 B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.11½°W., 114 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 34 B T.

A Pine, 48 ins. diam., bears N.21 ¾°W., 75 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 27 B T.

I measure West 21 lks. to temp. post, which is the dist. I intersect E. and W. line West of this cor.

Thence I run

S.0°W., on a true line between secs. 34 and 35.

Va. 19°E

About level on river bottom.

1.25 To S. fork of Umpqua River, course West.
