The witness tree in sec. 4 is dead. In it's stead I marked a Fir, 11 ins. diam., which bears N.36 1/2°E., 27 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 4 B T. At point of intersection set a stone, 14 x 6 x 6 ins. 10 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. to secs. 8 and 9 marked C C on S face with 4 notches on E. and 5 notches on</p>
