

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 33 ins. diam., bears S.48°E., 36 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.

From the  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor.

Thence I run

N.0°36'E., on a blank line between secs.31 and 36.

64.75 A ravine, course N.5°E., and S.5°W.

71.70 The cor. to secs. 30 and 31, 4 lks. East of my line,  
which is a post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set marked T 30  
S S 30 on NE R 3 W S 31 on SE faces, with 5 notches on  
N and 1 notch on S. edges. The marks are destroyed  
on the SW and NW faces, from which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.30°E., 13 lks. dist.,  
marked T 30 S R 3 W S 30 B T.

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S.45°E., 30 lks. dist.,  
marked T 30 S R 3 W S 31 B T.

I find 2 trees West of this line which agree in kind,  
size, direction and distance, with the field notes  
furnished me, but the marks have been destroyed and  
this being a cor. to secs. 30 and 31 only, I do not  
restore the marks.

Land, mountainous. 71.70 chs.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel and Maple. 71.70 chs.

Dense undergrowth of Vine Maple, Huckleberry, Hazel,  
Laurel and Fir, 60.00 chs.

T 30 S R 3 W S 18 on W. and T 30 S R 3 W S 17 on E.

A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.40°E., 19 lks. dist.,  
marked T 30 S R 3 W S 17 B T.
