5.00	Top of dividing ridge of waters flowing into O'Shea Creek from those directly into S. Umpqua, course N.70°W. and S.70°E., highest point on S. Bdy. along S. slope.	+100
16.80	A ravine, course S.; begin steep ascent. A prairie is N. about 5.00 chs.	-80
22.00	Top of spur, course S. and N.; begin descent.	+75
28.00	A dry gulch, course S.60°W.	-500
34.00	Begin ascent.	
40.00	Set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which  A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N. $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 22 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.  A Laurel, 9 ins. diam., bears S.4 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 21 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.	
	Open Fir timber; keep ascending.	
44.50	Top of ridge, course NW. and SE.; begin descent.	+50
50.00	A dry gulch, course S.60°W.	-600
59.00	A ravine, course S.; begin ascent; enter a burn, covered with young Laurels and Firs.	-200
69.50	Top of rise; descent, small Laurels and Firs.	
80.77	Intersect Offset of the Meridian line 495 lks. South of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. bet. Secs. 36 and 31., T. 30 S., Rs. 4 and 5 W., which is a Fir post, 3 ins. sq., firmly set into the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face, from which	-75
