CHAINS

A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears N.40*E., 34 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.29*W., 77 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

Set a Fir post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the
ground, for closing Cor. of Tps. 30 and 31 S., R. 4 W.,
marked T 30 S S 31 on N., R 4 W on E., T 31 S S 6
on S. faces, with 6 notches on N., E. and S. faces,
from which

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.52*E., 31 lks.
dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 31 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. in diam., bears S.53 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 72 lks.
dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 6 B T.

Standing in a grove of tall Laurels from 6 to 8 ins. in
diam.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse gravel; 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Laurel, Cedar and Maple.

Undergrowth, mostly young Laurels and Firs, Hazel,
Huckleberry.

In order to be sure that Deputy Ford did not run the
South Bdy. of this Tp. and set any Cors., I went
to the Cor. of Tps. 30 and 31 S., R. 5 W., on the
offset Meridian line, which is a Laurel post,
4 ins. sq., firmly set in the ground, marked
T 31 S R 5 W S 1 on SW., T 30 S R 5 W S 36 on NW.
faces with 6 notches on N., S. and W. edges,
from which

A Live Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N.50*W., 7 lks.
dist., marked T 30 S R 5 W S 36 B T.
