CHAINS		
	Timber, mostly Fir, few Laurels and Cedars. Undergrowth, Vine Maple, young Firs and Hazel.	
		Var. 19°15'E.
	South, on line bet. Secs. 35 and 36. Ascend mountain through Fir timber.	
1.00	An open timber flat, bears E. and W.	
4.00	Commence steep ascent of N. slope.	+40
14.00	Ascend E. slope, heavy underbrush.	
23.00	Top of main ridge, course SE. and NW.; follow on W. slope	+600
28.00	Leave timber; descend sharply through an old burn.	
40.00	A Fir, 40 ins. diam., which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., from which A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.22°E., 53 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Laurel, 3 ins. diam., bears S.5°W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Enter green Fir timber.	
44.45	Intersect South Bdy. of T. 33.90 chs.. W. of Cor. to Tps. 30 and 31 S., Rs. 3 and 4 W., which is a Laurel post, 4 ins. diam., firmly set in the ground, marked T 30 S S 31 on NE., R 3 W S 6 on SE., T 31 S S 1 on SW., R 4 W S 36 on NW. faces, with 6 notches on each edge, from which A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.60°E., 34 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 31 B T. A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.51°E., 45 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 3 W S 6 B T. A Laurel, 9 ins. diam., bears S.31°W., 40 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 1 B T. A Laurel, 9 ins. diam., bears N.16°W., lks. (omitted) dist., marked T ³⁰ 30 S R 4 W S 36 B T.
