CHAINS

A B. Oak, 30 ins. diam., bears N.73*E., 64 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.

This is the old bearing tree in Sec. 24, which I re-mark, the old mark being dim.

Thence

S.57*W., on true line bet. Secs. 23 and 24.

Var. 19*15'E.

Through prairie, with scattering Oaks.

13.50 Leave field; enter Oak openings.

19.10 Leave enclosure.

20.50 County road to Canyonville, course S.30*E. and N.30*W.

24.50 Right bank of S. Umpqua River, course NW., a bluff 20 ft. high. Set a flag; cross over in line S., run base W., 100 lks.; flag bears N.8*5'E., making 704 lks. across.

31.54 Left bank of river, a low gravel bar with some Willows and Alders growing thereon, overflown in winter.

39.57 The Cor. to Secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.

Land, rolling.

Soil, a loam mixed with fine gravel; 2nd rate.

Timber, Oak, Laurel and Alder.

Undergrowth, Willows.

Var. 19*10'E.

East, on random line bet. Secs. 24 and 13.

37.90 Intersect E. Bdy. of T., ^{29.90}25, 90 chs. South of Cor. to Secs. 13, 24, 18 and 19, which is a Laurel, 6 ins. diam., marked T 30 S S 18 on NE., R 3 W S 19 on SE., R 4 W S 25 on SW., S 13 on NE. face, with 3 notches on N. and S. edges, from which

A Laurel, 4 ins. diam., bears N.67*E., 42 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 3 W S 18 B T.
