

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., marked S 14 B T.

A Fir, 7 ins. diam., marked S 13 B T.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., marked S 11 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., marked S 12 B T.

I restore this Cor. by setting a basalt rock, 24x11x6, 18 ins. in the ground, marked with 1 notch on E. and 4 notches on S. edges, from which

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.5°E., 97 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 12 B T.

A Fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S.85°E., 37 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 13 B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.5°W., 55 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 14 B T.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.53°W., 35 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 11 B T.

These are the old bearing trees, the marks of which being dim, I re-marked.

Thence

South, on the true line bet. Secs. 13 and 14.

Var. 19°10'E.

Ascend through Fir timber.

1.00 Top of rocky ridge, dividing the waters of Day's Creek from those of S. Umpqua. +30

2.00 Brink of descent, a canyon, course SW., is before me, whose steep side, covered with loose gravel, makes it impracticable to chain. I set a flag South on top of next spur on line, lay off base E., 2.50 chs.; flag bears S.6°57'W., making 20.59 chs. across.

Mount Shasta, bears S.49½°E.

Worley's house bears S.3°W.

Stewart's barn, North end, bears S.5½°E.

22.59 Top of spur, course E. and W.; begin descent.
