20.50	Top of rise; begin descent.	+120
27.10	A branch, course N., 2 lks. wide, go along the N. end of hillside.	-70

39.70	The Cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12. Land, hilly. Soil, gravelly loam; 2nd rate. Timber, Fir, Cedar, Oak and Laurel. Undergrowth, mostly young Firs, Laurels, Oaks and Hazel.	-30
