17.00	A canyon, course SE.; begin ascent of E. slope of ridge, bears N.10*W., and S.10*E.	-200

33.45	The Cor. to Secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23. Land, mountainous. Soil, coarse gravel; 3rd rate. Timber, Fir, Oak and Laurel. Undergrowth, Greasewood, Willow, Hazel, young Firs, Oaks and Laurels.

23.00	Top of dividing ridge bet. waters of Day's Creek and S. Umpqua.	+60
26.00	Pass to N. slope of divide.	
28.00	Enter Fir timber; begin steep descent.	
40.40	Set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.34 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 10 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.	-30
