

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

(This is the old bearing tree, which I re-mark, the old marks being dim.)

A W. Oak, 6 ins. diam., S.50 $\frac{1}{4}$ *W., 222 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 10 B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.52*W., 202 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 3 B T.

Wood's house bears S.22*W. No tree in Sec. 2.

Thence

South, on true line bet. Secs. 10 and 11.

Var. 18*50'E.

Through grain field, bears E. and W.

- 3.70 Leave grainfield, enter farmyard.
- 4.50 Grainary.
- 11.50 Day's Creek, 25 lks. wide, course W.; leave enclosure.
- 13.00 County road to Canyonville, course W.
- 14.00 Enter grainfield, bears E. and W., slightly ascending.
- 21.50 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW.
- 26.15 Leave field, enter Oak openings; ascending broken hills.
- 32.60 A house bears East, 100 lks.
- 36.00 Same branch, 2 lks. wide, course NE.
- 38.64 $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. A post, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S is standing here, but it is not the original one. I find no Oaks, answering the size, bearing, or distances described in the field notes furnished me. There are plenty of Oaks around here, all have been chopped into for the purpose of discovering any marks, but the County Surveyor informs me, without success. There must be some gross mistake in the field notes of original survey, for it places Day's Creek 4.00 chs. N. of this Cor., while it is 27.00 chs. as the survey of Donation Land Claim No. 49 connects with this Cor. I run from this Cor. North 12.50, to South Bdy. of said Claim,
