CHAINS

78.94 Intersect N. and S. line, 153 lks. North of Cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.

Thence I run

N.88°53'W., on true line bet. Sec. 2 and 11.

Var. 18°50'E.

Through bottom, covered by Fir timber.

4.35 A branch, 3 lks. wide, course NE.

15.50 Enter low bottom, covered by Fir timber.

29.50 Rondeau's house bears N., 150 lks.; barn bears S., 100 lks.

34.00 County road to Canyonville, course W.

36.50 Day's Creek, 50 lks. wide, course S.60°W.

39.47 Set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which

A W. Oak, 8 ins. diam., S.52 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 152 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A W. Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears N.64 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 204 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

The old post set for this Cor. is gone, also the only bearing tree mentioned. The field notes of original survey are in error, as there^{never} has been an Oak on the East side of Day's Creek; and Day's Creek is only 36.50 chs. and not 53.00 chs. W. of Cor.

Var. 18°45'E.

39.57 Enter grainfield, bears N.

41.10 Enter thicket of young Oaks.

57.30 Leave Oaks; enter prairie and grainfield.

78.94 The Cor. to Secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

Land, rolling, almost level.

Soil, loam, mixed with fine gravel; 1st rate.

Timber, Fir, few Oaks, Alder and Maple.
