Oak, 24 ins. diam., bears S.27*E., 120 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A B. Oak, 20 ins. diam., bears S.62*W., 172 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. The W. Oak in Sec. 2 is plainly marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T, but the B. Oak in Sec. 2 has been chopped into and any marks thereon have been destroyed. I re-mark both bearing trees.
