1.00	Top of rise, along S. slope of hill; enter prairie.	+10
2.50	Begin descending.	
7.00	Enter field.	-50
17.00	Enter orchard, bears N. and S.	
19.50	Leave orchard; enter grain field N. and S.	
39.67	<p><math>\frac{1}{4}</math> Sec. Cor. The old post is gone, but both bearing trees are standing. I restore this corner by setting a Cedar post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math>S on N. face, from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A B, Oak, 36 ins. in diam., bears N.30*W., 360 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A B, Oak, 24 ins. in diam., bears S.86*W., 1010 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">These are the old bearing trees whose marks being overgrown, I renew.</p> <p>Thence</p> <p>N.89*29'W., on true line between Secs. 4 and 9.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Var. 19*30'E.</p> <p>Chapman's barn bears S.43*W.</p> <p>Stegner's house bears S.49*W.</p> <p>Raymond's house bears S.35*E.</p> <p>Through a grain field.</p>	
14.50	Leave grain field; begin ascent through Oak timber.	
17.00	Var. 17*55'E; pass along S. hill slope.
