7.00	Top of ridge, course N.30*E., and S.30*W.	+200
9.00	Begin descent; Var. 21*45'E.	
16.60	Foot of descent; begin ascent.	-80
20.50	Top of spur, course E. and W. Var. 20*E. Begin descent along W. slope.	+60
24.50	Change descent from W. slope to E. slope, enter an old burn densely covered by underbrush.	
31.50	Foot of canyon, course W.; begin ascent.	-100
38.00	Top of spur, course W. and N.; begin descent.	+75
40.00	Set a Laurel post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face, from which A Laurel, 4 ins. diam., bears S.83*W., 37 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Laurel, 4 ins. diam., bears N.70*E., 10 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. The old post and bearing trees have been destroyed by fire. Appearances indicate that this locality has been fired more than once, none but small Laurels, no larger than 4 ins. in diam. now growing here, with other underbrush of late growth.	-30
