

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS		
2.50	Top of spur, bears E. and W., descend.	
9.00	Foot of descent, begin ascent.	
11.00	Var. 20*10'E. Along N. slope, fir timber.	
18.00	Top of ascent, begin descent.	+50
31.00	Var. 21*30'E., along W. slope.	
35.00	Foot of descent, begin ascent.	-10
37.50	Leave fir timber, enter open hillside.	
47.50	Var. 21'E. Top of ascent.	+20
54.00	Intersect North Bdy. of Tp. 985 lks. W. of $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. on S. Bdy. of Sec. 32, which is a W. Oak post, 3 ins. square, firmly set in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears N.70*E., 63 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A B. Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears N.40*W., 30 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. For closing Cor. to Secs 6 and 5, I set a Laurel post 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked C C T 30 S R 4 W on S. face, S 5 on E. face, S 6 on W. face, and 1 notch on W. and 5 notches on E. faces, from which A Pine, 36 ins. diam., bears S.11*E., 163 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 5 B T. A B. Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears S 17*W., 208 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 6 B T. Var. 23*15'E. Land, mountainous. Soil, gravelly, 3d rate. Timber, Fir, Pine, Oak and Laurel. Undergrowth, mostly young oak, laurel, fir and pines. May 31, 1889.
