39.50	Top of Mt. ridge, course N. and S. Descend.	-1100
48.00	A rocky bluff 40 ft. high.	
59.00	A deep ravine, course NW. and SE.	
67.75	Shively Creek, 25 lks. wide, course North. Ascend.	Oct. 12, 1893. *100
77.03	To a point 21 lks. North of the Cor. to Secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35. As this is not a corner to Secs. 34 and 35 I destroy the marks on the NE. and NW. faces of this corner, and the marks on the witness trees north of this Cor.

	Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel and Maple. 77.03 chs.

	A Laurel, 30 ins. diam., bears N.29 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 41 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 34 B T.	
	A Fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S.6*W., 32 $\frac{3}{4}$ lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W C C S 34 and 35 B T.	
	Land, mountainous. 43.90 chs.	
	Soil, 3d rate.	
	Timber, heavy Fir, Laurel and Maple. 43.90 chs.	
	Undergrowth, dense with arrow-wood, laurel, vine-maple huckleberry and hazel. 43.00 chs.
