40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor.	
81.35	Intersect the West Bdy. of the Tp. 17 lks. North of the Cor. to Secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is a post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set, marked T 30 S S 30 on NE., R 4 W S 31 on SE., R 5 W S 36 on SW., and S 25 on NW. faces, from which A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.82*E., 57 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 30 B T. This tree is dead. In its stead I mark A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.17-3/4*E., 162 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 30 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.16*E., 16 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 31 B T.
