



Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

R 4 W, marked C C R 4 W on E., T 30 S<sup>S 31</sup> on N. and T 31 S S 6 on S. faces with 6 notches on N., S., and E. faces; from which

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.52\*E., 31 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 31 B T. This tree is dead.

The other bearing trees are burnt down. I mark 3 new witness trees.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.55\*E., 74 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W S 31 B T.

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.83 3/4\*E., 71 1/2 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 6 B T.

A Pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S.23 1/2\*W., 38 lks. dist., marked T 30 and 31 S C C R 4 W B T.

Land, mountainous. 88.80 chs.

Soil, 3d rate.

Heavily timbered with Fir, Laurel, Live-Oak, Chinquapin and Maple. 88.80 chs.

Undergrowth, Fir, Live Oak, Laurel, Vine-Maple, Arrow-wood, Hazel and Rhododendron. 88.80 chs.

In the field notes furnished me this line is given as 88.77 chs.

Var. 19 1/4\*E.

From the Cor. to Tps. 30 and 31 S R 4 W, I run North, on a blank line between Secs. 31 and 36. Ascend.

5.40 The 1/4 Sec. Cor. on my line, which is a post, 3 ins. sq., firmly set, marked 1/4 S on W. face; from which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.29\*W., 77 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears N.40\*E., 34 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S B T.

Descend.

23.00 A stream, 3 lks. wide, course SW. Ascend.

43.44 To a point, 9 lks. West of the Cor. to Secs. 25, 30, 31
