North bdy.

$\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. side and from which,

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N.5*E, 100 lks. dist.

marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears S.48*W, 21 lks. dist.

marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

64.00 A creek, 1 lk. wide course NE.

80.00 Broken rocky, steep N. slope.

89.61 Set a stone 18x12x6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for the corner to sections 2, 3, 34 and 35. marked with two notches on the east angle and 4 notches on the West angle of same and, from which,

A fir, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.12*E, 64 lks. dist.
marked T 30 S R 5 W S 35 B T.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.54*E, 72 lks. dist.
marked T 31 S R 5 W S 2 B T.

A live oak, 10 ins. diam., bears S.28*W, 9 lks. dist.
marked T 31 S R 5 W S 3 B T.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.26*W, 14 lks. dist.
marked T 30 S R 5 W S 34 B T.

Land, high mountainous, rocky and broken.

Soil, 4th. rate.

Mountain covered with a dense forest, chiefly fir, some cedar and laurel.

Thick undergrowth, of cedar & laurel, with live-oak, and balm.

August 21, 1882

S.89*38'E, on a tree line between Secs. 2 & 35.

Va.19*E.

Steep descent.

4.50 Canyon Creek, 40 lks. wide, course N.

5.75 Canyon toll and stage road, course North.

7.00 Begin steep ascent.

40.00 Set a laurel post 3 ft long, 3 ins. sq. 18 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the N
