

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

## Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.

## CHAINS

- 15.50 Head of a canyon, course N. 120 ft. below top of spur, begin very steep ascent.
- 19.50 A more moderate steep ascent of NE. slope.
- 28.50 Top of ridge, bears NW and SE, 140 ft. above cor.
- 33.00 Leave big fir timber, enter oak timber, bears N & S. along N. slope of ridge.
- 38.57 Set a laurel post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on N. face, from which,  
A B oak, 16 ins. in diam., bears S.49\*E, 17 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.  
A B oak, 10 ins. diam., bears N.81 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E, 36 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.  
Along top of ridge, bears SE and NW.
- 41.50 Begin slight descent.
- 45.00 Foot of descent, about 40 ft. begin to ascend.
- 50.00 Top of ridge, bears SW and NE; 150 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., leave oak timber; begin descent of NW slope through dense undergrowth of small firs, laurels and hazels.
- 78.57 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12; 400 ft. below ridge. Land, mountainous.  
Soil, gravelly; 3rd. rate.  
Timber, fir, oak, laurel, willow, maple.  
Dense undergrowth of small firs, laurel, hazel and poison oak.  
Mountainous or heavy timbered land.  
78.57 chains and 3.03 chs. on closing lines.

- N.0\*1'W, on a random line bet. secs. 1 and 2.
- 40.00 Set temp  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor.
- 81.00 Set a temp. post, a fire has destroyed the timber in the supposed neighborhood of the sec. cor. A few trees are blazed E & W; but cannot determine whether they belong to the township line or a trail that passes here.  
To be finished, when the missing sec. cor is re-established.
