

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

62.00 Top of ridge, bears SW and NE. 50 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.,
begin descent of SE slope.

70.00 Leave large oak timber, enter dense undergrowth of
small cedars.

79.70 Foot of descent, 450 ft. below top of ridge.

A branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW., begin ascent through
dense undergrowth of hazel, vinemaple and arrow-wood.

82.70 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, 40 ft. above branch.
Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly and 3rd. rate.

Timber, oak, fir, laurel, cedar, pine.

Dense undergrowth of small cedar, hazel, poison oak,
arrow-wood, laurel & firs.

Mountainous land, 82.70 chains, and 5.32 chs. closing
line.

July 29, 1896.

I begin at the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14, & 15, which I
re-establish by setting a fir post 3 ft. long, 4 ins.
sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 10, 11,
14 and 15, marked T 30 S S 11 on NE., R 5 W S 14 on
SE., S 15 on SW., and S 10 on NW faces with 4 notches
on S. and 2 notches on E. edges and witnessed as
described by the surveyor general, thence I run.

N.0*2'W, bet. sec. 10 & 11.

Very steep ascent of mountain, through a dense under-
growth of small firs.

0.75 A dim trail, bears S.10*E and N.10*W.

10.75 Top of mountain, bears E and W. 600 ft. above sec. cor.
School house at Canyonville bears S.13*W., begin descent
of N. slope.

33.50 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW., 800 ft. below top
of mountain, begin ascent.

36.00 Top of ascent, 160 ft. high, begin descent.

38.90 A branch 5 lks. wide, course E. 250 ft. below top of
ascent, begin steep ascent through heavy fir timber.
