Subdivisions of T. 30 S. R. 5 W.

CHAINS	
	Thence I run, West, on random line bet. secs. 10 and 15. Steep ascent through burnt oak and fir timber.
40.00	Set temp $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. A diligent search failed to show a trace of a corner or any line.
80.64	Intersect N. and S. line, 24 lks. S. of cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, as temporarily established by me. Thence I run, S.89°50'E, on a true line bet. secs. 10 and 15. Ascend through burnt oak timber, bears N. and S.
4.00	Top of rise, enter fir timber.
5.50	A cliff of rocks is N. of line, pass along steep S. slope of mountain, ascending.
18.00	A gulch, course S., begin steep ascent.
23.50	Top of dividing ridge bears SE and NW., 400 ft. above sec. cor.,
31.00	Begin further ascent through a windfall of deat young fir timber.
39.00	Leave windfall, bears N and S.
40.32	Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which A laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears S.60°E, 6 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N.45°W, 16 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Keep on ascending of N. slope of mountain, through heavy undergrowth of small firs and arrow-wood.
55.80	Top of dividing ridge, bears E and W., 130 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., entered scattering oak timber.
67.60	Leave oak timber, enter heavy undergrowth of small firs, and hazels.
77.10	A gulch, course S.
77.60	Begin descent of dividing ridge, bears SW and NE.
80.64	The cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15., 150 ft. below top of ridge.
