

Subdivisions of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, gravelly, 3rd. rate.
 Timber, oak, fir, laurel & pine.
 Dense undergrowth of small firs, hazels, arrow-wood.
 Mountainous land. 80.64 chs.

July 22, 1896

I re-establish the cor. of sec. 9, 10, 15 and 16, described above, by setting a basalt stone 14x6x6 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, marked with 4 notches on S. and 3 notches on E. edges, and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable. ✓

No sound trees within limits.

Thence I run

N.0°2'W, bet. secs. 9 and 10.

Ascend the S. slope of mountain through oak timber.

- 12.25 Top of dividing ridge, bears NE and SW., 300 ft. above sec. cor. pass along W. slope slightly descending.
- 14.10 A B oak, 18 ins. diam., with a surveyors blaze on each side, N and S. begin descent through dense fir and hazel undergrowth.
- 20.10 Top of spur, bears E and W., 60 ft. below top of divide.
- 27.00 Descent of E. slope, with heavy undergrowth.
- 34.50 Change to W. slope descent, through small fir timber.
- 40.00 A fir, 14 ins. diam., which I marked ¼ S on W. side for ¼ sec. cor., from which,
 - A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.63°W, 20 lks. dist. marked ¼ S B T.
 - A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S.80°E, 13 lks. dist. marked ¼ S B T.
- Very steep descent.
- 56.25 A canyon, course W., 800 ft. below divide.
- 60.25 Top of spur, bears NW and SE, 150 ft. above canyon, begin descent.
- 67.50 A canyon, course W. begin steep ascent of S. slope
