The timber, being mostly oak on S. and SW. slopes and fir on the N and E slopes is to scattering to be of any commercial value.

There is not to exceed 2 acres of arable land along Weaver creek in the SW portion of sec. 4 and about 100 acres of level prairie land in the NW corner of sec. 4, part of which is claimed and owned already under the donation land claim act.

The most of Section 4 are open lands, partly covered by oak timber but badly broken by ridges and gulches.

Retracements of Subdivisional lines of T. 30 S., R. 5 W. As surveyed by Oscar F. Thiel, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, under his contract No. 658. dated May 21, 1896.

Thence I run,

N.89°43'E, on true line bet. secs. 12 and 13.

Descend E. mountain slope through heavy fir timber.

14.95 A creek, 8 lks. wide, course SE., 150 ft. below sec. cor. begin ascent of W. slope of mountain, covered by heavy fir timber and thick undergrowth of hazel and arrow-root.

35.00 Top of ridge, bears N. and S., 250 ft. above creek, begin descent of E. slope.

39.59 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears S.35 lks. It is a laurel post evidently set by the Co. Surveyor, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

52.05 A stream, 3 lks. wide, course S., 200 ft. below top of ridge; begin ascent of W. slope covered by oak timber and heavy hazel underbrush.

69.50 Top of ridge, bears N and S., 175 ft. above stream,
