54.90	<p>found, fire appears to have been here at different time.</p> <p>A dry branch, course S., 500 ft. below top of spur, begin ascent of the East, slope of a spur, covered with scattering oak timber, and dense undergrowth of oak grubbs.</p>
77.60	<p>Top of spur, bears N and S., 200 ft. above dry branch, begin descent.</p>
79.70	<p>Intersect N and S. line 45 lks. south, of cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 & 17, which is an oak post 24 ins. high, 4 ins. sq. set evidently by the Co. Surveyor, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. Fire Has also been around here.</p> <p>Land, mountainous.</p> <p>Soil, gravelly; 4th. rate.</p> <p>Timber, oak, laurel, fir, pine.</p> <p>Mountainous, land.</p>
28.00	<p>North, on line bet. secs. 8 & 9.</p> <p>A very steep ascent of mountain slope, covered by oak timber.</p> <p>Top of ridge, bears SW and NE, 350 ft. high, begin descent on N. slope of mountain, covered with small fir timber, and laurels, thick underbrush of hazel and arrow-wood.</p>
39.85	<p>The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears E. 62 lks. it is an oak post, 24 ins. high, 3 ins. diam., badly decayed on the outside; marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p> <p>Keep on descending.</p>
79.76	<p>Intersect E. and W. line., 130 lks. W. of cor. of Secs. 4, 5, 8 & 9.</p> <p>Land, mountainous.</p> <p>Soil, gravelly; 4th. rate.</p> <p>Timber, oak fir, laurel.</p>
