CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The quality of land in this township is about the common average, better adapted to pastoral or grazing purposes than agriculture.

The soil situated on both sides of Cow Creek is of an excellent quality.

This stream, containing banks 15 or 18 feet, usually overflows its banks in winter, or times of high water.

The hills are usually covered to their summits with a good coat of grass.

The middle and NE part of the township are well adapted to grazing, intersperced with springs and living streams of water.

Timber chiefly fir, cedar, sugar-pine, pitch-pine, oak and laurel, are abundant and easy of access.

There are several ledges of sandstone, quartz are found abundantly in the south and southwest parts of the township, several gold diggings have been opened in the south and SW parts.
