40.00 Set fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 18 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on W. face, from which

A Yew, 7 ins. diam., bears S.80°W., 26 lks. dist.

Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B. T. and

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.82°E. 24 lks. dist.

Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B. T.

Ascend.

53.00 Top of spur, course, SE. Descend

63.70 Creek, 2 lks. W. course SE. Ascend.

80.00 Set a Laurel post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, marked T 30 S R 7 W S 10 on N E., S 15 on S E., S 16 on SW and S 9 on NW faces with 4 notches on the S and 3 notches on E edges from which an Oak, 9 ins. diam., bears S.76°E., 61 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 15 B. T.

A Cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears S.20°W. 62 lks. dist.

Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 16 B. T.

No trees in limits on secs. 9 and 10. Made stone mound about post 2 ft. high, 4 ft. at base, pits impracticable.

Land mountainous, soil 3rd. rate.

Densely covered with forests of fir, Pine, Laurel, and Cedar, with thick undergrowth of Fir, Pine, Laurel and Cedar.
