CHAINS

The closing of the random line between secs. 10 and 15 being entirely outside the limits prescribed by the Manual of Survey, I returned to the cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21, and 22, whence I run N. 89° 56' E. between secs. 15 and 22 va. 18° 30' E. and at 40.66 chs. found the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. and at 84.41 chs. found the corner to secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.

Thence I run N. between secs. 14 and 15. va. 19° E. and at 40.04 chs. found the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. and at 82.69 chs. found the cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

October 3.

Thence I run . between secs. 10 and 11. Va. 20° 30' E. and at 40.55 chs. found the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor. and at 81.15 found the cor. to secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.

Thence I run N. 0° 41' W. between secs. 2 and 3.

Va. 21° E.

and at 41.40 chs. found the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor, and at 78.10 chs. found the Tp . cor.

October 4, 1882.

Then from the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, I run N. between secs. 9 and 10. Va. 19° 30' E.

Steep ascent through prairie.

19.50 Top of high ridge, course E. and W.

Descend through thick timber.

40.00 Set stone 13 x 7 x 7 ins. 9 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face from which

A Laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 40° W., 23 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B. T and

A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 21° E., 47 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B. T.

47.00 Along very steep W. sidehill.

80.00 Set Laurel post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. to secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10 marked
