85.00 Intersect Tp.. line 269 lks. N. of the cor. to secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, which is a post 4 ins. sq. firmly set in the ground and marked T 30 S R 7 W S 7 on NE. S 18 on SE., R 8 W S 13 on SW., and S 12 on NW faces with 4 notches on S and 2 notches on N edges from which

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.56*E., 22 lks. dist.
Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 7 B. T.

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.56*E., 27 lks. dist.
Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 18 B. T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.65*W., 3 lks. dist.

A Pine, 18 ins. diam., bears N.47*W., 17 lks. dist.
