CHAINS

This portion of the township is mountainous broken land covered with heavy fir, yellow pine, live oak, white oak, black oak and myrtle with dense undergrowth of same, including tan oak and arrowwood.

The mineral appears to be chromium and placer gold along the creeks.

The township boundary runs over a series of conglomerate bluffs.

There is some good agricultural lands to be found along the creeks.

There are no settlers in this portion of the township.

The Paul Sphoon homestead in Sec. 32 has been abandoned.
