12.60	Table Creek, 6 lks. wide, course SE. Along S. slope of mountain.
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor.
80.58	Intersect Township line 141 lks. South of the Corner to Secs. 25, 30, 31 & 36, which is a stone 14x12x4 in. firmly set in the ground, and marked with 1 notch on the South and five notches on the N. angle of same, and from which A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.30*E., 14 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 30 B T A Fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S.75*E., 44 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 7 W S 31 B T A Cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears S.50*W., 23 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 8 W S 36 B T A Cedar, 5 ins. diam., bears N.80*W., 43 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 8 W S 25 B T
40.29	Thence I run S.89* West on True Line bet. Secs. 25 & 36. Va. 19*15' East. Set a Stone 14x14x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the North face, and from which A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.33*W., 80 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A Live Oak, 4 ins. diam., bears N.59*W., 33 lks. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
80.58	To the Corner to Secs. 25, 26, 35 & 36. Land, mountainous, and East part rocky and broken. Soil, 2d and 4th rate. Timber: Dense forests of fir, cedar, pine and laurel. Thick undergrowth of same kinds of wood, with live oak, arrow-wood and hazel. October 19th, 1882.
