CHAINS	A Laurel, 24 ins. diam., bears S.70*E., 23 lks.dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
79.45	To the Corner to Secs. 1, 2, 11 & 12. Land high and rolling. Soil, clay and rocky, 3d rate. Timber: Fir, cedar, laurel and pine. Thick undergrowth of same kinds of wood, with live oak, mountain balm and hazel. October 22d, 1882
	North on Random Line between Secs. 1 & 2. Va. 19* East. Moderate Ascent.
35.00	Top of Ridge, course NE. & SW. Descend.
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. Steep descent, NW. slope.
76.00	Intersect North Boundary of Township 92 lks. West of established corner for Secs. 1 & 2, which is a Maple post firmly set in the ground, three sided or tri- angular, and marked T 29 S R 8 W S 35 on the N.face, T 30 S R 8 W S 1 on the SE. face and S 2 on SW. face. Also 1 notch on the East and 5 notches on West angle of same, and from which A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.2*E., 30 lks. dist. Marked T 29 S R 8 W S 35 B T A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.24*E., 75 lks. dist. Marked T 30 S R 8 W S 1 B T A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.59*W., 61 lks.dist. Marked T 30 S R 8 W S 2 B T Thence I run S.0*40' West on a True Line bet. Secs. 1 & 2. Va. same.
36.00	Set a Fir post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., from which
