General Description.

This Township is nearly all mountainous, with occasional small strips of bottom land along the streams.

The Soil of the Uplands is mostly red clay, 2d and 3d rate. That of Bottoms, alluvial and 1st rate.

The entire Township is densely covered with large timber, consisting mostly of fir and pine, with some Cedar, laurel and chincapin. The most valuable timber is Fir, Sugar Pine and Cedar.

There are five settlers in the Township, viz., 2 in Sec. 25, one in Sec. 12, one in Sec. 18 and one in Sec. 21, all having considerable improvements.
