## Resurvey of North Boundary of T. 32 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

I destroyed the marks on the cedar that bears S.10°E.,  
and mark

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.37°E., 47 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 31 S R 1 W S 32 B T.

I then continued the line on West, from this cor.

74.50 A point about 250 ft. above last sec. cor. and top of  
ridge, bears N. and S.

And descend 50 ft. to

77.59 A point where my closing cor. established in running  
North on W. bdy. of T. 32 S. R. 1 W., bears South 151  
lks. dist., which is a basalt stone, 15x12x12 ins. 10 ins. in  
the ground, mkd. C C on S. with 6 notches on S, E and  
W edges.

from which

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.70°E., 11 lks. dist.,  
mkd. C C T 31 S R 1 W S 31 B T.

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S.55°E., 5 lks. dist.,  
mkd. C C T 32 S R 1 W S 6 B T.

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S.37°W., 15 lks. dist.,  
mkd. C C T 32 S R 2 W S 1 B T.

Making a total bearing to South in mile of 3.20 chs.

And a total bearing in North bdy. of T 32 S R 1 W of  
12.42 chs. and making my close on the W. bdy. of  
T 32 S R 1 W in limits.

Land, high and mountainous.

Soil, 2nd rate.

Densely covered with forests of fir, cedar, sugar pine  
and yew, 77.59 chs.

Thick undergrowth of fir, yew, chinquapin, matherone and  
maple.
