CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township is mountainous and covered with dense forests of fir, cedar, sugar pine and some oak, of good quality with generally a thick undergrowth of fir, matherone, dogwood, maple, etc. One or two claims are taken in the Southern portion of the Township and it should be subdivided.

Willamette Meridian through T. 31 S.,

I begin at the closing cor. for T. 31 and 32 South, Ranges 1 W., which is a basalt stone, 10x15x5 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

From the closing cor. above described, I run,  
North, bet. secs. 31 and 36, over gently rising ground, through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.

6.50 A fir, 40 ins. diam., on line I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

25.00 Summit of divide, 50 ft. above T. cor., course NE. and SW., descend

Difference bet. measurements of 40.00 chs. by two sets of chainmen is 6 lks., position of middle point
