

Dependent Resurvey of Portion of South Boundary  
of T. 30 S., R. 1 W.

## CHAINS

- 5.34 Leave rocky prairie; enter timber, bears NW. and SE.  
16.79 Enter rocky prairie, bears N. and S.  
23.68 Leave rocky prairie; enter timber, bears N. and S.  
25.10 620 ft. above 1/4 sec. cor.; descend 465 ft. over SE. slope.  
37.04 Point of intersection of line bet. secs. 1 and 2, determined as hereinafter described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap marked

- A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears S.74\*E., 29 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 31 S R 1 W S 1 C C B T.  
A maple, 14 ins. diam., bears S.74\*W., 18 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 31 S R 1 W S 2 C C B T.

- 37.06 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SW.  
40.01 The old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a fir, 12 ins. diam., with marks grown over; from which  
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.40\*E., 14 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 31 S R 1 W S 1 B T. (Old B T. )  
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.80\*W., 32 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 31 S R 1 W S 2 B T. (Old B T.)  
The bearing tree in sec. 36 is dead and fallen, and the old bearing tree in sec. 35 is rejected as appropriate witness, on account of intervening younger growth of trees and better witness now available; the marks on this old tree are deeply overgrown and not disturbed.  
I now change this cor. to refer to secs. 35 and 36 only, and obliterate the marks on the bearing trees referring to secs. 1 and 2.
