33.13 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.

34.20 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 165 ft. over SE. slope, to 1/4 sec. cor.

37.99 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.
