General Description

This fractional township is very hilly, but a large portion of it is open and affords considerable pasturage. The Timber is principally Fir, Pine, Oak and Cedar. The soil generally is too stony, for cultivation. The unsurveyed fraction of the township is very mountainous entirely unfit for settlement.
